The department of economics is one of the oldest departments of this university. It started functioning on 18th July 1946. This department has been actively involved in researches in various sectors of Economy.

About The IEA

The Indian Economic Association (IEA), a registered body of economics professionals in India, came into existence in 1917 due to the pioneering initiative of Prof. C.J. Hamilton and Prof. Herbert Stanley. Both scholars worked to organize and advance research in the economic field and to deliver lectures. In 1916 Prof. Hamilton formed the Bengal Economic Society. He then called a conference in Kolkata in 1917 in which economic scholars from all over India were invited. The Bengal Economic Journal was published to publish its findings. The Indian Economic Association (IEA) is the oldest of the Indian economic associations. Since 1918 IEA has been holding annual conferences without any major break. IEA conferences witness huge participation and debate by economics professionals, academics, scholars and policy makers. IEA has hosted the World Economic Congress once. The International Economic Association was established in New Delhi in 1986 under the chairmanship of Professor Amartya Sen. The former presidents including Prof Amartya Sen include economists like Dr. Manmohan Singh; C.N. Vakil; D.R. Gadgil; V.K.R.V Rao; A.K. Dasgupta; D.T. Lakdawala; Prof. K.N. Raj; I.G. Patel; V.M. Dandekar; M.S. Adhishesha; P.R. Brahmananda; Kamta Prasad; C.H. Hanumantha Rao; Raja Chelliah; V.R. Panchamukhi; Gautam Mathur; Prof. G.S. Bhalla. IEA started its prestigious journal-Indian Economic Journal in 1946 which is still being published. IEA aims to promote research in the economic sector. It talks about the economic situation and dynamics in the country, especially in the global context. Indian economy is rapidly moving towards rapid development.IEA has organized 106 annual conferences so far - mostly held on 27-29 December every year.

About The Seminar

The seminar provide platform for the international dialogue on the theme Intellectual Property Rights and Behavioral Economics: Changing Various Dimensions of the Indian Economy on two consecutive days through the offline/online platform on 6th -7th February, 2025.
